

Fiona SAMPSON

Fiona Sampson's books have been published in more than thirty languages, has received the Zlaten Prsten (Macedonia) and the Charles Angoff Award (US), and been shortlisted for the Evelyn Encelot Prize for European Women Poets. From 2005-2012 she was the Editor of Poetry Review; she is now a Poetry



Professor at the University of Roehampton, where she is the Director of the Roehampton Poetry Centre and Editor of Poems. A Fellow and Council Member of the Royal Society of Literature, Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, Fellow of the

English Association and Trustee of the Wordsworth Trust, her publications include twenty-four volumes of poetry, criticism and philosophy of language. She has received the Newdigate Prize, a Cholmondeley award, a Hawthornden fellowship, Kathleen Blundell and Oppenheimer-John Downes Awards from the Society of Authors, Writer's Awards from the Arts Councils of England and Wales and various Poetry Book Society commendations and has been shortlisted twice for both the T.S. Eliot Prize and Forward prizes. Recent books include a new edition of Percy Bysshe Shelley for Faber (PBS Book-club Choice) and Coleshill (Chatto, PBS Recommendation). The US edition of her selected poems appeared from the Sheep Meadow Press in 2013.

Peter SALMON

Peter Salmon is an Australian writer living in the UK. His first novel, The Coffe Story (Sceptre, 2011), was the New Statesman Book of the Year. He has written frequently for Australian TV, radio and broadsheets including The Guardian and the Sydney Review of Books. The Bluse News, his satirical column about books and publishing



was sebsequently collected and published by Melbourne University Press as Uncorrected Proof (2005). he has received Writer's Awards from Arts Council of England and the Arts Council of Victoria, Australia. Formerly Center Director of the

John Osborne / The Hurst Arvon Centre(2006-2012), he also teaches creative writing, most recently at Pembroke College, Cambridge and Liverpool John Moores University.
