# **Participants**

This programme is for you if you are:

- a person working with teenagers or young adults (aged 16-25) in some way of non-formal education
- willing to implement your knowledge back home, and preferably have a concrete project to practice with
- active member of an NGO or informal group of young people
- you are aged 20+ (there is no upper age limit)
- preferably interested in participating in the further actions and phases of the project
- if you live in: Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Israel or the Netherlands







## Program

Day 0 Arrival to Tel-Aviv

**Day 1**. First group meeting and trip to kibbutz Neot Semadar (350 km from Tel-Aviv); getting to know the kibbutz

**Day 2.** Meditation-walk on the grounds of the kibbutz; joining the work; meeting about mentoring volunteers; time for Q+A

Day 3. Joining the work; meeting the youth of

the kibbutz and the people who work with them; participants share their experiences

**Day 4**. Closing and departure to Hava veAdam (300 km from the kibbutz); introduction to the Educational farm of Hava veAdam

**Day 5-7**. joining the work on the farm; participating in 3 out of the 5 possible workshops; meeting the different people working on the farm; sharing experiences

**Day 8**. Closing and evaluation; departure to Tel-Aviv in the evening hours; good-bye party on the beach

Day 9. departure day

## Dates

Arrival day is Saturday, the 5th of November, and in any case make sure that you land **latest until 10:00 am on Sunday the 6th of November** 

Departure: make sure your plane departs after 22:00 on the 13<sup>th</sup> of November

Your board and accommodation is covered only during the programme. If you want to arrive earlier than the 5th of November or leave later than the 14th, contact the organisers. Please note that in the programme there is no time for sight-seeing or visiting religious sites. If you wish to extend your stay for this reason, contact the organisers, we will be happy to help you with advices.

#### **Venues**

The first and last night will be in a hostel or other simple kind of group accommodation in Tel-Aviv. In Neot Semadar and Hava veAdam we will sleep in 4-6 bedded tents, which have electricity, airconditioning and heating, and beds and mattresses.

You need to bring your own bedsheets/sleeping bags and towels.

The toilets and showers are outside of the tents.

You will get detailed information on how to pack, what to bring after you are accepted to the programme.





## Costs

The organiser, the Connecting Routes Group covers:

- food, accommodation and transport during the duration of the program
- international travel up to the limit
- insurance costs up to the limit
- all the costs and materials of the programme

### Participants cover:

- travel costs above the limit
- 60 Euros participation fee, to be paid in cash on arrival to the programme
- insurance costs above the limit



## Reimburrement

Your travel and insurance costs will be reimbursed until the below mentioned limit. Please note that the limit is given from your home until arriving to Tel-Aviv city, and it does not include the costs of the inner transportation. However, this is also covered by the same grant, this is why we reduced the amounts you can spend in order to arrive to Tel-Aviv, in order to avoid that you need to pay your own travel within the country.

Please note that the limit includes the amount you can spend on insurance as well.

Your travel costs are reimbursed if:

- you participate in the full length of the programme
- you keep your boarding passes, and you send back all the tickets, invoices, boarding passes by post to the organisers on arrival back home
